Security & Safety

- Please do refer any security issues to Vern, rumors of vandalism have been circulating.
- Neighborhood Watch is being investigated. Any residents interested in supporting Neighborhood Watch please contact Vern.
- Speeding is still an issue, let's all do our part by slowing down – we had a speed awareness trailer, and the board are examining next steps, including citizen run radar collection. From the city: Citizen Radar Tracking (Optional) If Step 1 (speed awareness trailer) fails to reduce or prevent speeding, residents from the neighborhood may obtain a hand-held radar unit to monitor traffic and record vital motorist information. Speeding motorists will be sent a letter, not a ticket, from the city informing them of the violation and requesting they obey neighborhood posted speed limits. Neighborhood Signs (Optional) Signs provided by the city can be placed by the residents in their yard outside the city right-of-way (typically 10' back from the edge of the pavement) for up to 30 days. This notifies drivers that the speeding concerns are those of the residents, not just the city. The next step after this is enforcement, having the police issue tickets, and finally, Engineering which may include Signing, striping, and continuation of the Education and Enforcement efforts, Speed Humps on local streets, Speed tables, traffic circles and choker islands on local and minor collector streets.
- Please park vehicles in garage as per ARCS 22. “All residences must have a garage. Plan garage so it is not the focal point of the building when viewed from the street. All vehicles should be housed in garages.” Let's support the intention of this ARC standard, to keep the streets free of parked vehicles for the safety of our pedestrians as well as other drivers on our narrow streets and for the security of vehicle owners, by limiting the opportunity or temptation for vehicle break-ins or vandalism

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Pets

- **Owners MUST Cleanup after their pets. Revised Code, City of Scottsdale, Arizona Chapter 4 Animals, ARTICLE II. KEEPING OF DOMESTIC ANIMALS, Sec. 4-17. Sec. 4-18. Sanitary requirements. (f) Any person owning, possessing, harboring or having the care, charge, control or custody of any dog shall immediately remove and thereafter dispose of any fecal matter deposited by the dog on public or private property, unless the property owner has given prior approval to use the property for this purpose. The dog fecal matter shall be immediately placed in a closed or sealed container and thereafter disposing of it by depositing said matter in a trash receptacle, sanitary disposal unit or other closed or sealed container. This subsection shall not apply to blind persons accompanied by a dog used for their assistance. (Code 1972, § 4-204)**
- **Pets MUST be leashed. Revised Code, City of Scottsdale, Arizona Chapter 4 Animals, ARTICLE III. ANIMAL CONTROL, Sec. 4-39. Dogs not permitted at large; wearing licenses; penalties. (c) No dog shall be permitted at large. Each dog shall be confined within an enclosure on the owner's property, secured so that the dog is confined entirely to the owner's property, or on a leash not to exceed six (6) feet in length and directly under the owner's physical control when not on the owner's property. (e) If any dog is at large on the public streets or public property, then said dog's owner or persons acting for the owner is in violation of this ordinance.**

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Parking

Sec. 17-127. Parking wrong way.

Except as otherwise provided by law, every vehicle stopped or parked upon a roadway where there are adjacent curbs shall be so stopped or parked with the right-hand wheels of the vehicle parallel to and within eighteen (18) inches of the right-hand curb.

Sec. 17-128. Habitual offenders.

(a) Any person who commits a violation of this article, after previously having been found responsible for three (3) or more violations of this article within a three (3) year period, whether by default or by judgment after hearing, and who has not paid the civil sanctions required by the court for those offenses (underlying offenses) shall be guilty of a class 3 misdemeanor.

(b) The payment of the civil sanctions due on an underlying offense, when such payments are made after the issuance of a summons and complaint on a charge of being a habitual offender, shall not be a defense to the habitual offender charge.

(c) A Violation of this section is punishable as class 1 misdemeanors are punishable under state law. The court shall order a person who has been convicted of a violation of this section to pay a fine of not less than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00), exclusive of any other fees, surcharges and penalties required by state statute, for each count upon which a conviction under this section has been obtained. A judge shall not grant probation to or suspend any part or all of the imposition or execution of any sentence required by this subsection except on the condition that the person pay the mandatory minimum fines and other fines and charges as provided in this subsection.

(d) Every action or proceeding under this section shall be commenced and prosecuted in accordance with the laws of the state relating to criminal misdemeanors and the Arizona Rules of Criminal Procedure.
